Background : The aim of this study is to compare the effectiveness of teaching about providing care in 1st stage of labour and delivery by using a videotape and the acceptance of this videotape teaching technique

Method : 90 3rd year nurse students of Kuakarun Collage of Nursing, class 1999 (2nd semester) were enrolled in this trial. A prospective randomized trial was performed in 2 groups. Both were comparable in terms of number of students and average study score. A 25 item multiple choice questionnaire was administered to both control and experimental groups. The experimental group answered an additional 10 item questionnaire about videotape acceptance and videotape teaching. All tools were approved by experts and analysed via \bar{x} , t-test

Conclusion : 1. The effectiveness of teaching about providing care in labour and delivery by using the videotape was statistically significant at ($P < .05$)
2. The videotape teaching technique was accepted well in the experimental group.
