The objective of this study are to examine ear protection habits of female workers in the textile industry and to investigate the relationship between cognitive, biological, work - related factors and ear protection habits. One hundred and fifty – three female workers from a medium – sized industrial textile factory were interviewed by using a structural questionnaire. The data were analyzed by using percentage, mean, standard deviation. The relationship was tested using chi – square and t – test.

The results revealed that only 31.4% of textile worker used ear plugs. Moreover, most of them used ear plugs incorrectly. In addition, earplugs cleaning and changing of new earplugs were not trolled correctly. As for the relationship between cognitive, biological and working – related factors and ear protection habits, the analysis indicated that self – efficacy, work section and age of the workers were significantly related with ear protection habits. P < 0.005
