ABSTRACT	
Thailand has been rapidly changing in economics,	
technology and population. For example, the increase in income,	
the development of the extensive transit system and the increasing	
cultivation of land. These changes have had impacts on the	
environment, particularly in soil, water, air, and living conditions	
of Thailand's population. The advancements have been depleting	

Thailand's natural resources, and contributing to the fast

deforestration each year.

Thesis Title The Participation of Sub-district Council

This arises from the lack of participation by the people, and their lack of knowledge of conservation. These problems have motivated to study "The Participation of Sub-District Council Committees in Forestry Conservation". The objective of this study is to aid in developing guidelines for forest conservation.

In this study, data were collected by using questionaires.

The area surveyed was in the Lower North-Eastern area of Thailand.

The sample were 408 sub-district council committee members. They

were natives to the region and played a role in forest conservation.

Therefore, there should be some criteria for the

conservation of national forest resources. In the past years

the plan for preserving forest has not been very effective.

The analysis of this study showed that the sub-district council committee members had medium level participation in forest conservation. The contributing factors which had effects on the support in partcipation of in forest preservation were as follow: the status of sub-district council committee members, information about forest conservation by mass media, the economic status of

In contrast the lack of forest preservation occurred for several reasons. The main problem was that most sub-district council committee members did not have the time for active participation in the program. In addition, members that tried to participate in the

sub-district council committee members, and the method of obtaining

firewood.

program found that there was a constant lack of finances, seedlings, other officials and support of people. Also, another major problem was from forest poachers cutting wood in reserved area.

It is concluded that the sub-district council committee members are interested in high level participation. In order for this to be achieved, education by mass media is needed. In addition, the project should originate from the sub-district council committee members. They need to play an active role in the planning implementation and evaluation of the forest conservation project. To increase forest preservation all the above information needs to be used to develop quidelines. Support is needed not only from sub-district council committee members but the entire nation. Participation of the public is needed to stop destroying and start preserving.
