

Thesis Title The Relationship Between Demographic Factors,
Daily - life Activities and Satisfaction with
Life Among Aging

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Abstract

The main objective of this study was to determine the relationships between demographic factors, daily - life activities and satisfaction with life among aging

303 aging, the member of the senior citizens clubs of Ratchaburi nursing college were sampled as the study groups. The interview with questionnaires was used for data collection. Percentage, mean, standard deviation, median, quatile deviation, Pearson's product moment correlation coefficient, point biserial correlation coefficient, and stepwise multiple regression analysis were employed for data analysis.

It was found that aging was highly satisfaction with life and moderately with the daily - life activities. Daily - life activities, and some demographic variables such as

marital status, education level, income, family relationships and health status were significantly correlated with satisfaction with life. In addition, satisfaction with life was accounted for health status, daily - life activities and family relationships with variance, approximately 61 percent. And the relationship between daily - life activities, and demographic factors except sex were statistically shown.

This study indicates that for health of aging each organization should be strengthened in promotion of health care, daily - life activities and social participation among aging.
