ABSTRACT

The main purpose of this research is to study our response
some desirable characteristics as perceived by contemporary Thai
society represented by people in the metropolitan Bangkok and
chaiyaphum province

The research is divided into 2 parts. The first is mainly
conceived with an analysis of the scripture and commentaries while
the latter is dedicated to the study of data collected in the field
between 1988-1989. In the first part it is found out that the monk
have to adhere seriously to the dhamma and disciplines set forthly
to Buddhism. The field work reconfirmed these as the most desirable
characteristics of Buddhist monks. Yet, at the same line, Bangkok
people wants monk to have additional secular knowledges complementary
to these knowledges and dhamma while people in Chaiyaphum province

prefer monks to be more oriented to the forest monk tradition.

Reflected to the trend of aspect Thai Buddhism it is more ariental toward secular knowledge and the continuing of priest's practical tradition.
