ABSTRACT

The purpose of this survey research was to examine the opinions of 292 city police officers towards their job performance according to the Act of Public Cleansing and City Orderiness B.E. 2535 in 3 different aspects: the content issues and obstacles on law enforcement, the relationship between purposive samples' opinion and their dependent variables such as age, educational level, income, etc. and suggestions for better law enforcement.

The result showed that this particular Act was moderately appropriate to enforce. Most city police officer pin pointed on unclear content of the act, lack of personnel, knowledge and facilities and lack of some specific authority as obstacles to their job performance. The suggestions were that the Government Policy on enforcement of this Act should be known clearly and every individual citizen should realized his own right and responsibility under the Act through various means of public relations.

It was found that the relationship among opinion, length of time occupying position and length of time in Government Service were statistically significant (p < 0.05)

while the other were not.
