	Abstract
The purposes of this research were to study the relationships	
among leaders behavior in terms of personal relations and work rela-	
tions of superiors as well as the levels of morale and job satis-	
faction of subordinates; and to compare the levels of morale and job	
satisfaction of subordinates in divisions where superiors had dif-	
ferent levels of leadership in regarding to personal relations and	
work relations. A total of 258 subordinates working in 18 divisions	
and other equivalent offices in the Office of the Permanent Secretory	

for Public Health were included in the study by using questionnaires.

Thesis Title

Leaders' Behavior of Department

The results of the study revealed that the levels of leadership of superiors in the Office of the Permanent Secretary for Public Health regarding both personal and work relations were moderate and had positive relationship with morale and job satisfaction levels of subordinates. Significant different levels of morale and job satisfaction were found among subordinates in divisions where superiors had different levels of leadership. The conclusion was that, morale and job satisfection levels of subordinates were varied directly with leaders' behavior of superiors.
