ABSTRACT

The main point of this study was to focus on personality norms of psychiatric patient and normal people by Gordon Personal Profile - Inventory. The objectives of this study were :

1. to adapt GPP-I into Thai language and to be standardized.
2. to compare personality scales between psychiatric patients and normal people.
3. to develop percentile norm and T-score norms for psychiatric and normal groups.

The subjects of this study were 200 psychiatric patients from in patients and out patients of Siriraj Hospital and Somdejchaophaya Hospital. Another groups consisted 200 normal people. They were randomly selected from normal people who worked in Bangkok.

Data collections were done by asking subjects to complete

Gordon Personal Profile - Inventory which was designed by Leonard V. Gordon. This Inventory can measure 8 personality scales : Ascendancy, Responsibility, Emotional Stability, Sociability, Cautiousness, Original Thinking, Personal Relations and Vigor. The sum of Ascendancy, Responsibility, Emotional Stability and Sociability could measure Self - Esteem. The reliability of this inventory was 0.54 - 0.89.

The result of this study suggested that psychiatric patients had significantly different personality scores from normal people at statistical level of .05 except Original Thinking scale which showed that there were not significantly different between two groups at the statistical level of .05. However the result showed tendency to suggest that the mean score of psychiatric patients were lower than normal people.
