

Thesis Title	Police Superintendents' Opinions on Expected Impacts of Changing the Royal Police Department to Ministerial Status
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ABSTRACT

The objectives of this research are to investigate police superintendents' opinions on expected impacts of changing the Royal Police Department to Ministerial Status ,in order to know the opinions of police superintendents on changing the police administration , including to compare the opinions of police superintendents with different backgrounds toward the changing. The data are gathered from 254 samples (58.2 percent of all police superintendents) by questionnaires. The finding of this study were following :

1. Most police superintendents tended to agree with changing the Royal Police Department to Ministerial Status and agreed that the changing is good for police officers , police organization and public.

2. The police superintendents with 6 years and more in the positions had higher opinions of the advantage of changing for police officers and police organization than the samples with

less 6 years in the positions .

3. The married superintendents had higher opinions of the advantage of changing for public than the single one.

4. The police superintendents that held the line and staff had good opinions of the advantage of changing for police officers , police organization and public.

5. The police superintendents that held the staff had higher opinions of the advantage of changing for police officers, police organization and public than the line's but not significantly.

Recommendations.

1. There should be the training of organization administration for all levels of administrative personnels.

2. There should be the training of police science for all levels of police personnels.

3. There should be plans and projects of ethical development for police personnels.

4. There should be improvement of internal administrative system of police organization to increase the efficiency of the police organization.
