ABSTRACT

This descriptive survey was aimed at investigation of factors that affected the registered nurses' preceptorship roles in supervision of student nurses in the main northeast teaching hospital of nursing colleges under Ministry of Public Health. A sample of two hundred and eighty two registered nurses was taken from Khon Kaen Hospital, Nakhonpanom Hospital, Maharajnakornratchasima Hospital, Mahasarakham Hospital, Saphasittiprasong Hospital and Udonthani Hospital. A stratified random sampling was used. The research instruments were developed questionnaires consisted of demographic data, opinions about factors affecting registered nurses' preceptorship roles and registered nurses' preceptorship roles. The questionnaires constructed by the researcher and validated by the experts. The reliability coefficients of questionnaire was 0.99 (Cronbach's Alpha Coefficient test). Data were analysed by using a SPSS/FW for frequency, percentage, mean and standard deviation. The statistical methods used for testing the hypotheses were factor analysis and multiple regression analysis.

Research findings were :

Factors that affected to registered nurses' preceptorship roles were : clinical learning experience management, perception of professional roles, practice's time management, attitude toward professional practice, clinical learning supportment, clinical physical environment , time management for nurses' activity and priding in nursing profession with statistical significant level at $P<.0001$ ($R = 0.80$, $R^2 = 0.64$).
