

Thesis Title The Ego State of Administrators and Satisfaction
 of Teachers in Primary Schools under Bangkok
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ABSTRACT

The purposes of this study were to investigate the ego state of the administrators of primary schools under Bangkok Metropolitan, satisfaction of teachers towards administrators of various ego states and differences of satisfaction of teachers towards administrators.

The population were administrators who had been in this position for over 1 year and teachers from 427 primary schools under Bangkok Metropolitan. The sample group consisted of 128 administrators and 384 teachers of primary schools under Bangkok Metropolitan. A questionnaire was used to elicit information of general status, ego state within the limitation of research theory and the satisfaction of teachers towards various ego states of administrators. The data were collected by the researcher and then analyzed by means of descriptive statistics, percentage, arithmetic mean, standard deviation and one way analysis of variance.

The results of the research were as follows :

1. The ego state of the administrators varied. Most of them possessed adult ego state. Others possessed ego states of free child, nurturing parent, critical parent and adapted child, respectively.

2. The teachers were satisfied most with the administrators who possessed adult ego state and free child. Next in their satisfaction were the administrators who possessed adult ego state, nurturing parent and free child, free child, adapted child, critical parent and adult ego state and nurturing parent respectively.

3. The satisfaction level of the teachers towards administrators' ego states differed. The Scheffe test was conducted to measure the satisfaction level towards the administrators' ego states in pair. It was discovered that the ego state of critical parent compared with the ego state of nurturing parent, adult, free child, and adapted child was significantly influenced the teachers' satisfaction at 0.01. level. There was no significant difference at 0.01 level when the other ego states were compared.
