

Thesis Title	Actual Role and Role Expectation of Health Volunteers according to Self-perception and Health Personnel in Community Primary Health Care centers (CPHC) in Roi-Et Province.
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Abstract.

The purpose of this research was to compare actual role and role expectation of health volunteers according to self-perception and health personnel in Community Primary Health Care Centers (CPHC). A sample were 102 health volunteers and 51 health personnel. Data was collected by interviewing the sample group . One hundred percent of data was analysed.

The research revealed that the actual role and role expectation of health volunteers (base data, essential public health service and health education) was in low and high levels respectively ($x = 15.94$ and 12.64). The difference was statistically significance ($P < 0.001$). Role expectation according to self-perception and health personnel in all aspects was in high level with mean of 15.94 , 14.90 and was significantly difference ($P < 0.001$) and ($P < 0.05$) respectively. More over, it was found that internal factors and actual role of health volunteers were related in term of age, marital status, the period of being volunteers. External factors and actual role of health volunteers were related in term of

subsidy for training, information gaining from other sources and frequency of supervision.

The research recommendations were that health volunteers who work in CPHC should have the following qualifications: age between 31-45 years old, work duration between 1-5 years, married, have positive thinking about the subsidy for training, information gaining from other sources, frequency of supervision from health personnel at least once a month. Further more health volunteers should have CPHC's activities training about quality of drinking-water, setting of elderly club and AIDS-protecting group, procuring and selling of tooth paste and tooth brush, monitoring blood pressure and urine sugar, treating of common diseased and minor injuries.
