ABSTRACT

The objectives of the study are to find the opinions of establishment of administrative courts in Thailand , the model of administrative courts , and the appropriate responsible units to handle the courts. The data are collected from 340 cases of lawyers , scholars in laws and governmental sciences , judges and members of the parliament.

The results of the study are summarized as follows :

The majority of the samples agree that the administrative courts should be separated from formal courts, but should still be handled by the Ministry of Justice.

The majority of samples agree with the establishment of administrative courts to ensure the justice for the people and to handle the works of the formal courts.

The courts established should be distributed to several

provinces in the country. The courts will strengthen the responsibilities of the governmental officers in works with people.

RECOMMENDATIONS :

1. There should be distribution , public relation, exhibition and brochures concerning the establishment and function of administrative courts.

2. The state should urgently establish the administrative courts to protect the civil rights and the misuse of power of state authority.

3. There should be promotion of Knowledge to the relative personnels , such as, scholarships and seminar on administrative courts from experts in the field.
