ABSTRACT

This Study aimed at the factors affecting the efficiency of Sub-Investigation Inspectors of the first region Provincial Police. The factors included personal, social, and economic backgrounds, and obstacles in crime investigation both inside and outside the police station.

The research was conducted in surveying, in which questionnaires were used to collect data from 300 Sub-Investigation Inspectors in 51 police stations in the first region Provincial Police, and evaluated by Computer through Analysis of Variance and Multiple Classification Analysis.

The findings were summarized as follows:

1. Sub-Investigation Inspectors who graduated from Police

Cadet Academy have more obstacles in police station in investigations and the ones who graduated from Police Private Training school have less obstacles in police station investigation.

2. Sub-Investigation Inspectors who have 11-15 years of work duration have most obstacles outside police station in investigation. And Sub-Investigation Inspectors who resided in the house to let have the most obstacles in side police station in investigation, who resided in their own houses have least obstacles outside police station, and Sub-Investigation Inspectors from middle economic class have more obstacles inside police station in investigation, and who came from rich families have least obstacles in side police station in investigation.

4. Sub-Investigation Inspectors who used the official vehicles in investigation, have more obstacles outside police station, and who used their own vehicles have least obstacles outside police station in investigation.

Recommendation :

1. Police Cadet Academy should improve the training procedure in investigation for Police Cadets to increase their performance efficiency in investigation.

2. The Royal Thai Police should appoint the less working time and high economic class police officers to be Sub-Investigation Inspectors.

3. There should be provision of the government residence for all the investigation officers.

4. There should be provision of the vehicles for the investigation officers in investigation.
