The result of study revealed that depression associated with nutritional self-care (NSC) (P <.05). Even good NSC still showed inverse effect to nutrients and energy intake. For other factors, weight, body mass index, hemoglobin, side effect and anxiety showed no association to NSC. Patients who stayed either in hospital or rehabilitation home or their own homes had similarity of NSC.
