precautions for AIDS prevention respectively. There was significantly association between the training on Universal precautions and the readiness in the knowledge. The perception of severity of HIV infection and benifits to use Universal precautions were significantly the readiness in attitude towards Universal associated with precautions. The readiness in knowledge of Universal precaution was 3.6% predicted by the training on Universal precautions. The readiness in attitude towards Universal precautions was 43.5% predicted by the perception of benifits to use Universal precautions, severity of AIDS and susceptibility of HIV infection. From in-depth interview, majority of the nurses were not strictly using Universal precautions, lack of supervisory to its utilization and low quality of meterial supplies such as eye glasses and boots.

It is recommended that the quality of Universal precautions in AIDS prevention among nurses at community hospital, must be strengthened by training, supervising and providing the appropriate eye glasses and boots to health care personnal.
