The Needs for Participating in Health Care and Family Preparation of Psychiatric Patient's Relative.

Abstract

The purposes of the research were to study the disease by patient's relatives for participation in health care while the patients were admitted and how they prepared themselves to recieve the patients when they returned home.

Data were collected by interviewing 108 relatives of schizophrenic patients who were admitted to Khon Kaen Neuro-Psychiatric Hopital

results found that most of the relatives (67.59 %) had emotional conflict with the patients. They had negative and positive feelings at the same time. 88.88 % of them believed that if they came to visit the patient in hospital, it could help the patient to recover, but they could not come because of economic 25.00 % of the patients had recovered. 91.67 % of them reported obstacles (e.g. no have time, no experience, ecomomic problems and boring) preventing them from participating in caring for patient in the ward. 89.89 % supported the patients by talking and 54.10 % of them never encoraged the patients to have any activity which the hospital set for the patients. 72.22 % of the relatives understand how to care for the patient at home. They had a suitable plan for the patient when he/she retern

home. 87.96 % of them needed health personnel to help them, for

example: to teach them health education (38.84 %) and give

knowledge to develop thier neighbors attitude (18.18 %)
