

Nuanjan Suriyapitakkoon 2009: Acceptance of Male Sexual Deviant Behavior among the Airlines Staff at Suvarnabhumi Airport. Master of Arts (Applied Sociology), Major Field: Applied Sociology, Department of Sociology and Anthropology. Thesis Advisor: Mr. Suraphan Bejrapha, M.A. 100 pages.

The purposes of this study were to examine the acceptance of male sexual deviant behavior among the Airlines staff at Suvarnabhumi Airport. Acceptance of male sexual deviant behavior was identified in the context of demographic factors and social factors by using questionnaires as data collecting tools from 292 of Airlines customer services department. Statistics analysis were percentage, mean, standard deviation and hypothesis testing by t-test and one way Anova at 0.05 significantly statistic level.

The results indicate that majority of the respondents were female with an average age 30.13 years old, education in Bachelors' degree level from University in Thailand, single with average monthly incomes 21,856.16 baht and are highly accepted on male sexual deviant behavior. The demographic factors found to be significantly related with acceptance of male sexual deviant behavior are sex, age, education and monthly incomes. The social factor which related with acceptance of male sexual deviant behavior is experience of interaction with male sexual deviant behavior. All of the variables are related to the acceptance of male sexual deviant behavior among the airlines staff at Suvarnabhumi Airport. The acceptance for living and working together are in high level but the acceptance for occupancy in the social is in moderate level.
