ABSTRACT

The study was conducted in Wiset Chai Chan district of Ang Thong Province of Thailand. Primary Health care in Thailand was based on Village Health Volunteers and Village Health Communicatorss. It was important to know their job satisfaction so as to analyse their problems and improve conditions conducive to Health For All goal.

The results of the study showed that there was no significant difference between the two groups of VHCs. In Some areas, male VHCs revealed greater satisfaction

whereas in others, female VHCs were more satisfied than males. Areas in which there was significant difference in job-satisfaction had been identified and they should be included in task-allocation.

There was significant association between educational status of the VHCs and Job-satisfaction. This point should be kept in mind while selecting VHCs. It was also observed that with advancing experience the level of satisfaction declined. This was a crucial issue and should be highlighted by operational research.
