The objectives of this research were to study Emotion and Behavior Deviation of 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grader at O-ngen Elementary School, Bangkok. The sample consist 193 student. The computer program were used to analyze the data. The statistical tools used in this study were percentage, means, standard deviation and chi-square. The statistical significance was set at 0.05 of 193 the 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grader at O-ngen Elementary School, Bangkok.

The study assumes that many factors affect to emotion deviation and behavior deviation, i.e., sex, number of brothers/sisters, sequence of birth, parent's occupation, the family's condition, the family's relationship, the family's income, rearing patterns led, residential area, and school environment.

The study of factors affect to emotion deviation indicated that the number of brothers/sisters, sequence of birth, parent's occupation, the family's condition, the family's income and residential area were not related to emotion deviation but the sex, family's relationship, rearing patterns led and school environment were related to emotion deviation. The study of factors affect to behavior deviation indicated that sex, parent's occupation, the family's condition, the family's relationship, family's income and rearing patterns led were not related to behavior deviation but the number of brothers/sisters, sequence of birth, residential area and school environment were related to behavior deviation as conforming to the assumption.
