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The objectives of this study were to determine and evaluate factors that affect job satisfaction and the level of satisfaction in the performance of mob control duties by police officers in the Riot Control and Suppression Sub-Division. The samples of the study were 375 commissioned and non-commissioned police officers in the Riot Control and Suppression Sub-Division. The data were collected through questionnaires and descriptive data were analyzed to test the hypothesis. These included frequency percentage, mean, standard deviation, analysis of variance and multiple classification analysis .

The results showed there is a low level of job satisfaction salary or rewards from job performance. There is moderate level of job satisfaction concerning working conditions, relationships with colleagues, relationships with superiors, job security, job advancement and job achievement.

The study recommends that salary and fringe benefits be raised, in addition, police officers should be given opportunities for job reshuffling or transferring to other location to enhance their job satisfaction. This will lead to better performance in mob control by more qualified and efficient personnel.
