as well as organizing or participating in activities was low. Therefore, as a result, the total mean represented the overall students' access on ecotourism information though people media was low at 1.50.

Part 3 Attitude of Students toward Ecotourism

The figure from Table 7 shows that most students had a highest level of attitude on both the information that the exhaustibility of tourism resources effected by inappropriate uses (Item # 2), and the idea that the cooperation between government and private sectors was required to support stable ecotourism (Item # 10), with the mean value at 4.34 and 4.28 respectively. While, the lowest level of the students' attitude towards ecotourism (Mean = 3.14) was medium or moderate on the information that ecotourism management was a kind of investment with chances of
