

Saranya Tiawattananont 2010: Members Control in Saving and Credit Cooperatives.

The objectives of this research are to 1) study the behavior of members in control of the Saving and Credit Cooperatives in Bangkok 2) compare the controlling behavior of members in cooperatives which have different characteristics. The 145 Saving and Credit Cooperatives in Bangkok are selected from the total of 330 cooperatives as the sample of the study. T-test and F-test are used for statistical analysis.

The results of this study indicated that 49.9 percent of members of the Saving and Credit Cooperatives in Bangkok directly control their cooperatives by attending in the General Assembly and 55.2 percent of members in directly control by elected the Broad of Director and Cooperative Auditor.

The study found the negative relation between the size of cooperatives and the percent of members joining in General Assembly and also size of cooperatives and the percent of members voting for their Broad of Director and Cooperative Auditor.
