The purpose of this research is to present the relationship between the domestic rubber market and Thai Law in order to study market structure, production, Laws concerning the rubber trade, and Laws enforcement. It includes an analysis of legal problems affecting rubber growers, in terms both product prices recessed and income derived.

This research found that Thai Law relating to the domestic rubber market authorizes the state to intervene in all aspects is the rubber industry. But in practice, the State intervenes only in the aspects of rubber reserves intransection, rubber trade, and rubber export. State policy does not support rubber growers directly, although it offers tax relief or exemptions from the cess to rubber growers. In addition the Laws provided the rubber authorities an opportunity to use their legal power without judgement. The present Thai Law an the rubber industry was promulgated at a time when the world rubber economy was the recession and was intended to serve the International Rubber Regulation Agreement as Thailand was one of its members.

When the agreement expired, the Law became out of date and failed to provide essential relevant details or transparency. The state should intervene in order to control the changed situation of the rubber market. But the enties law is still in force and has not been ammended to correspond to the present market situation.

In the future, if the state wants to achieve a solution to the problem is low urbber prices and low incomes of rubber growers, it would be proper to revise the law to correspond to the present conditions in the rubber market.
