




This research is designed to study the role of pressure group in campaigning for constitutional amendment during the May 1992 uprising. In particular, it studies the methods and approaches employed by those groups in their campaign.

The research finds that the demand for the amendment was initiated by political groups which were against the constitution that allows a non elected MPs to become prime minister. The groups began campaigning against the appointment of the NPKC leader as prime minister after the March 1992 elections. The campaign aimed at revising the constitution to make only elected MPs eligible for premiership which would result in termination of the NPKC's political domination. The groups were successful in mobilizing mass support for their campaigning against the NPKC and for the amendment. The mass support outside the Parliament was a key factor leading to their success in dethroning the NPKC and the revision of the constitution.
