

Kanseenee Deerod 2010: A Study of Parents' Satisfaction Toward Management of Early Childhood Education Under the School of Bangkok Metropolitan Administration. Master of Education (Early Childhood Education), Major Field: Early Childhood Education, Department of Education. Thesis Advisor: Associate Professor Pattamavadi Lehmongkol, Ph.D. 115 pages.

The purpose of this research was to determine parents' satisfaction toward kindergarten schools under the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration.

The sample of this study consisted of 400 parents of preschool children studying in kindergarten schools under the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration in the second semester of 2008 academic year. The instrument used in this study was questionnaire on parents' satisfaction toward kindergarten schools. The collect data were analyzed by the application of percentage.

Results indicated that parents were highly satisfied with the management of kindergarten schools under the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration in all aspects as follows: 1) for academic section: parents were satisfied most with curriculum designed by the schools; 2) for role of the teachers: parents were satisfied most with the cooperation between teachers and parents to seek appropriate ways of learning activities, child rearing and solving problems for each student; 3) for environmental section: parents were satisfied most with well-constructed and the safety of school buildings; 4) for service section: parents were satisfied most with measures of accidental prevention and other emergency problems; 5) for relationship between schools and parents: parents were satisfied most with the opportunity for parents to communicate on school operation.
