Peeraya Ngoenthee 2008: Opinions of Foreign Tourists toward Recreational Settings at Patong

Beach, Phuket Province after the Tsunami 2004 and Need for Revisiting the Area in the Future.

The study is aimed to study the opinions of foreign tourists toward recreational setting at Patong

Beach after the Tsunami 2004 and to investigate the need for revisiting and factors affecting the need for

revisiting the area in the future. The survey was administered to 400 foreign tourists who had visited Phuket

province between May and October 2006. Discriminate analysis method was applied to calculate the collected

data through a computerized software package.

The result found that most tourists was male, aged between 21 and 30 years, and had a domicile in

Europe. Their education background was in Bachelor's degree. Most of them was single, worked in private

sector with income more than 60,000 baht per month, and traveled to Phuket province by plane with 4 persons

in group. Tourists who have and have not ever visit Patong Beach before Tsunami disaster were nearly equal.

This was the first trip to visit Phuket province after Tsunami disaster on the touring proposes by individual

travel. Most of them was exposed to the information through internet and the ratio of tourists who obtained

less and great extent the knowledge about Tsunami is similarly.

For the tourists' opinions, the study found that the opinions toward recreational settings and

suitable facilities around Patong Beach that, as a whole, their applicabilities were at the medium and high

levels, respectively. The tourists perceived the positive image of Patong Beach more than the negative image

at the 73.4% and 26.6%, respectively. When considering in satisfaction toward Patong Beach as a whole, it

also was at the medium level and 79.5% need for revisiting Patong Beach again.

Regarding the factors affecting the need for revisiting the area in the future, the study revealed

that there were three factors namely opinions toward recreational setting, image of Patong Beach, and

satisfaction toward Patong Beach as a whole. Using discriminate analysis, the function of discriminate model

had 72.85% efficiency of group classification.
