The objectives of this study were to study the opinions of tourist police officers on the work performance of female tourist police officers in crime protection and suppression and the factors related to the opinions of tourist police officers on the work performance of female tourist police officers in crime protection and suppression. The stratified random samplings in this study were 257 tourist police officers. The instrument used in this study was questionnaires. Statistics used in computer program analysis were frequency, percentage, mean and standard deviation, Analysis of Variance (ANOVA) and Multiple Classification Analysis (MCA). The level of statistical significance was set at 0.05.

The results of this study found that the level of opinions of tourist police officers on the work performance of female tourist police officers in crime protection and suppression was moderate. Factors related to opinions of tourist police officers on the work performance of female tourist police officers in crime protection and suppression were age, marital status, work experience of female tourist police officers and perception of information of female tourist police officers. Level of education, salary, work experience, tenure and position did not relate to the opinions of tourist police officers on the work performance of female tourist police officers in crime protection and suppression.
