


Hathairat Narksin 2007: The Juvenile's Opinion towards Family and Community Group Conferencing. Master of Arts (Political Science),
Major Field: Political Science, Department of Political Science and Public Administration. Thesis Advisor: Associate Professor Jatuporn Banchuen, M.S.S., 88 pages.

The objective of this research was to study juvenile's opinion towards family and community group conferencing. The sample for studying was 150 young people in Juvenile Observation and Protection center. A questionnaire was used as a tool for data correction and analysis. Data were analyzed by using computer program. Statistics obtained includes percentage, means, standard deviation, t-test and One Way ANOVA analysis with the statistical significance level at .05.

The results of this research indicate that the opinions of juvenile towards family and community group conferencing was high. When the hypothesis is tested in order to compare the opinions of the sample towards family and community group conferencing, it is found that if the living environment, family relationship and knowledge of family and community group conferencing are different, the opinions for towards family and community group conferencing are also different. However, in the case where sex, age, level of education, characteristic of perpetration, the opinions towards family and community group conferencing are not different.
