

Sukhumarn Somsukcharoen 2011: Emotional Quotient, Family Relationship and Suicide At-Risk Prevention of the TO BE NUMBER ONE Project's Members. Master of Arts (Development Social Sciences), Major Field: Development Social Sciences, Faculty of Social Sciences. Thesis Advisor: Associate Professor Chailai Sakdivorapong, N.M. 176 pages.

The objectives of this research were to study: 1) the level of emotional quotient, family relationship and suicide at-risk prevention of the TO BE NUMBER ONE project's members, 2) comparison of suicide at-risk prevention of the TO BE NUMBER ONE project's members classified by personal factor, 3) the relationship between emotional quotient with the suicide at-risk prevention and 4) family relationship with the suicide at-risk prevention of the TO BE NUMBER ONE project's members.

The samples of this study were 318 members of TO BE NUMBER ONE project who obtained service at Friend Corner Future Park Rangsit Branch. Data were collected by questionnaire and analysed by using computer program package. Statistics used for data analysis were percentage, mean, standard deviation, t-test, F-test, Least Significant Difference (LSD) and Pearson's Product Moment Correlation Coefficient. Statistically significant was at .05 level.

The results of this research indicated that 1) the emotional quotient, family relationship and suicide at-risk prevention were at high level, 2) the members of the TO BE NUMBER ONE project who had difference personal factors did not difference suicide at-risk prevention with statistical significance at .05 level, 3) the emotional quotient had positively related to suicide at-risk prevention with statistical significance at .05 level and 4) family relationship had positively related to suicide at-risk prevention with statistical significance at .05 level.
